Gus Macker Zanesville 2027 Confirms Venue Through Regional Community Partnership

The Gus Macker Zanesville 2027 Executive Committee is pleased to announce that the tournament venue has officially been confirmed through a collaborative partnership between Ohio University Zanesville, Zane State College, and the YMCA of Zanesville. This milestone marks a significant step toward bringing one of the nation's most recognized 3-on-3 basketball tournaments back to Muskingum County in 2027.

Since planning began in December 2025, community leaders, volunteers, sponsors, and local organizations have worked together to prepare for the tournament's return. With the venue now confirmed, the committee will continue refining operational plans and preparing for contract discussions with Gus Macker headquarters.

"Gus Macker is more than a basketball tournament," said Dominique Proctor, Executive Chair of Gus Macker Zanesville 2027. "It's an opportunity to bring communities together, support local businesses,

Visit Zanesville held a ceremony to recognize the second round of 2026 Tourism Development Grant recipients, A Taste of Ohio Wine Bourbon & Beer, Artist Colony of Zanesville, and The Bright Spot Campground and Marina, on Thursday, July 30, at the Welcome Center.

"Tourism is more than just attracting visitors. It supports the local economy in more ways than one, and gives people a reason to experience the unique places, events, and hospitality that make Muskingum County so special," said CVB Manager Jordlin Harmer. "It's about telling a story and creating a feeling. Visit Zanesville is honored to invest in our storytellers. From established events to exciting new ideas, each recipient shares a commitment to strengthening our community through tourism."

The grant program was established to invest in projects and experiences that are designed to increase the number of visitors to Muskingum County and encourage overnight stays. Muskingum County Tourism Grant funding is made possible through funds obtained from county lodging tax revenue.

A Taste of Ohio Wine Bourbon & Beer

"Our space is very big, and in the good weather months, we expand our space by closing down the alleyway, so it creates just a natural gathering place for people, and several customers have approached us and asked us if we could put something together to have multiple musicians in our space, so they helped us collaborate and come up with this Y-Bridge Music Fest. We're going to hold it on October 17th, hoping to have five bands come in, and really pleased that David Spires is going to help us with the audio production," explained A Taste of Ohio Wine Bourbon & Beer co-owner Angela Bailey.

The grant money will be used to market the event and to pay the bands for their time.

"We really want to do a mixed-genre event. We want to, just like our name, A Taste of Ohio, we want you to come in and taste all the different wines, bourbons, and beers. We want you to come to this venue and listen to all the different kinds of music, because perhaps you didn't know what you liked until you heard it, right? Same thing with wine. You don't know you like a certain wine until you taste it. So I think that having all the different genres come into this music fest lends itself nicely to exactly what we do inside this venue with our wine bar," Bailey explained.

A Taste of Ohio Wine Bourbon & Beer is a family-owned lounge that recently celebrated its second anniversary. The business has doubled its operating hours and is hosting

a myriad of events, including bingo and live music as well as book, writing, and craft clubs, and a new Euclypse club.

Artist Colony of Zanesville

The Artist Colony of Zanesville (ArtCOZ) promotes local artists through their monthly newsletter, website artcoz.org, social media platforms, and events like the monthly First Friday Art Walks and the very popular annual Y-Bridge Arts Festival, a free public event held during the summer.

The grant awarded to The Artist Colony of Zanesville will support the Y-Bridge Arts Festival.

"The Y-Bridge Arts Festival is a chance to celebrate our local artists. And that's certainly the feature. I have 68 group spaces, so there's a wide variety of mediums there. But the festival also celebrates our musical artists. We'll have dancers there. So just a wide variety of arts being celebrated there. But we also have a full schedule of live music, all kinds of food trucks. And we want to make sure folks know there's children's activities there. So all ages are welcome. And the children will have plenty to do there, such as art projects as well," explained ArtCOZ President Mark Goodall.

This year's Y-Bridge Arts Festival was just held on July 31 through August 1. It was the 16th year for the two-day festival and featured 68 artist spaces at the Zane State Campus, utilizing both the Campus Green and Campus Center.

"We've been at Zanes State a couple years now. This is our second year at Zanes State. And I think that just provides the best opportunity for indoor and outdoor space. They have a beautiful campus," Goodall mentioned.

"We just appreciate the partnership from Visit Zanesville. And we love the opportunity to celebrate our artists. And they've been able to help us with our marketing. And we hope that we can reach just as many people as possible with the festival and all of the activities we have planned," said Goodall.

The Bright Spot Campground and Marina

The Bright Spot Campground and Marina recently opened and is located just south of Blue Rock at 10200 S. River Road, McConnellsville. The Bright Spot offers affordable campsites and gear rentals, as well as both day and seasonal access to the Muskingum River. Since opening this spring, the campground continues to grow with new features and events

being added.

The Bright Spot will be hosting its inaugural Halloween event the last weekend in October. The grant funds they received from Visit Zanesville will go towards this event that will wrap up their first regular season (although if the weather allows, there may be additional camping days available into November).

"We're really excited to be part of the community," explained The Bright Spot Campground and Marina co-owner Tessa Pratt-Smith. "We're from Columbus, so it's very important for us to know more about this community. Our neighbors are amazing, so we've been really connected with them, and when we bought this place, our biggest goal was to make camping affordable and accessible, including to locals. So not just bring folks from outside of the area, but also support our local community. So the fact that we got this grant means we can continue doing that; we can offer daytime activities, so it makes us feel really connected with the community that we're trying to support in the first place."

"I think the biggest takeaway that I want people to have is that this space is for them. No matter if they've gone camping a million times, or it's their very first time. If they have a huge RV and an elaborate setup, or they don't even have a tent and this is their first experience using our rental gear. We really care about thinking of that list of reasons that someone might say the outdoors isn't for me and striking that down and saying it's for all of us to enjoy, appreciate, give back to. So the biggest takeaway is anyone who's thinking, should I go to the Bright Spot? Yes, it's open to you, and we're a safe space for you to come enjoy the outdoors," said Pratt-Smith, also adding. "If you're going through a rough patch, or maybe you're doing great and you just want to have that thing to look forward to, we hope that this will be a bright spot in people's lives."

3,355,828 Minutes read for MCLS Summer Reading Program

The Muskingum County Library System's "Unearth A Story" Summer Reading Program was a massive success with readers amassing a total of 3,355,828 minutes read throughout the two-month program, which concluded on July 31.

"Our community definitely showed up and participated and read a lot," said Sean Fennell, MCLS Marketing & Community Relations Director. "It warms my heart every time I think about how much people participated this year. We're going to have to set a really crazy goal next year, so I apologize to everyone in advance that we're going to have an even bigger goal next year to really challenge our community, because everybody really proved that they are not only up to the challenge, but beyond that as well."

Many families participated in the challenge. Through the Beanstack app, family members can compete and see who has read the most each week, adding a little friendly competition at home.

"We have about twice the amount of youth readers that we do adult readers," mentioned Fennell. "One of the most important things that we've done recently with summer reading is expanding that to all ages, because we understand that literacy and lifelong learning and being a library patron, those are all things that are learned from the adults in children's lives."

2,839 People registered for summer reading at MCLS. The annual challenge allows library patrons of all ages to register for the program and log minutes read in order to gain digital badges, reach milestones that earn tickets that can be entered toward prize drawings, as well as pick up weekly rewards for logging minutes each week.

"You know, we do have our weekly prizes for kids and adults to come in and pick up every week so that we are really making sure that folks have that incentive to visit because we want to see you more. Obviously, participating online is awesome too. You can participate in summer reading without ever having to step foot inside a building," said Fennell.

The challenge is about promoting learning throughout the summer no matter the age, but especially for children to help prevent summer slide. "It is proven as a very effective strategy to prevent that summer slide where kids just lose abilities over the summer because they don't practice them. You know, I mean, practice makes perfect, and reading and literacy is a skill which must be continually practiced throughout the rest of a person's life to maintain and grow," Fennell explained.

The prize drawings for summer reading have taken place, and the winners have been contacted. Although one challenge is done for now, others are planned throughout the year, each earning readers different badges and perks. Right now, a Back-to-School Challenge is active for school-age children, the 1000 Books Before Third Grade Reading Challenge, and the year-long Read Your Socks Off Challenge (open to all ages) takes place until the end of the year. Look for challenges monthly on the Beanstack App or stop by the library to participate.

Packing Healthy Lunches That Kids Will Actually Eat

As the school year begins, many parents face the challenge of packing lunches that are both healthy and appealing to their children. The good news is that nutritious lunches do not have to be complicated. With a little planning, families can create meals that support learning, growth, and energy throughout the school day.

A balanced lunch should include foods from several food groups. Aim to pack a source of protein, a whole grain, a fruit, and a vegetable. Protein foods such as lean meats, cheese, yogurt, eggs, or beans help children stay satisfied longer. Whole grains provide lasting energy, while fruits and vegetables contribute important vitamins, minerals, and fiber. Children are more likely to eat foods they enjoy, so include familiar favorites whenever possible. Instead of introducing several new foods at once, pair one new item with foods your child already likes. For example, add cucumber slices to a lunch that includes a favorite turkey sandwich and apple slices.

Getting children involved in lunch planning can also increase the likelihood that they will eat what is packed. Allow them to choose from a variety of healthy options each week. Giving children some control helps build healthy decision-making skills and reduces food waste. Think beyond traditional sandwiches to add variety. For example, whole-grain wraps, pasta salads, homemade snack boxes, cheese and crackers, or bean quesadillas can all make nutritious lunch options. Packing foods in small, easy-to-eat portions may also encourage children to finish their meals.

Sample Healthy Lunch

- Turkey and cheese wrap on a whole-grain tortilla
- Baby carrots with hummus
- Fresh grapes
- Low-fat yogurt
- Water or milk

This lunch provides protein, whole grains, fruits, vegetables, and dairy in a combination that is both nutritious and appealing to many children. A simple formula to remember is: Protein + Whole Grain + Fruit + Vegetable + Drink. Following this guideline can make lunch packing easier while helping children meet their nutritional needs.

Healthy school lunches do not need to be perfect. Small, consistent choices can help children develop healthy eating habits that support success both in and out of the classroom.

Additionally, a free meal ticket (1 per person) for Happy Camper Hot Dog Stand will be provided.

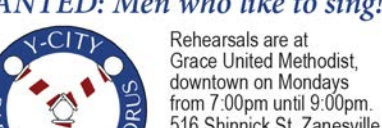

Because that tells me that not only did these gentlemen serve our country, now they're serving our community," said Jones before concluding the ceremony.

Tribute banners are hanging on light poles around historic Downtown Newark and will be displayed for a year. Banners are typically purchased by family members, and when it is time to take them down, the banners are returned to the purchaser.
