Straker Foundation hosts MVESC's new food truck, Capable Creations

The J.W. & M.H. Straker Charitable Foundation hosted a grand opening for the Capable Creations food truck on Thursday, September 17. All three Muskingum County Commissioners, Melissa Bell, Drake Prouty, and Cindy Cameron, attended, along with Straker Foundation staff and members of the Muskingum Valley Educational Service Center (MVESC) team. The food truck was made possible because of a \$100,000 grant through the J.W. & M.H. Straker Charitable Foundation. Students in the MVESC Adult Success Program operate the Capable Creations food truck, which offers a

selection of healthier meal options, including a Berry Bliss Smoothie, Peanut Butter Power Smoothie, and Tropical Green Fusion Smoothie, or yogurt bowls topped with fruit and granola in the same three flavors. Additional offerings are paninis (grilled cheese, ham and cheese, or Italian) and a variety of coffee drinks, including seasonal offerings: pumpkin spice for fall, peppermint mocha for winter, and raspberry white chocolate for spring. Loaded teas and other beverages are also on the menu. Christopher Robinson-Miller, was part of the five-person crew who served customers during the grand

opening. He was excited for the grand opening and mentioned that some of his favorite menu items are the grilled cheese panini and peanut butter smoothie. The implementation of the food truck goes far beyond serving good food to the community; it is providing valuable work experience and real-world skills for the students involved. Additionally, the food truck sets a strong example of how individuals with disabilities are capable of contributing to the workforce in a meaningful way. The slogan on the back of the staff shirts for Capable Creations says it best: Food with purpose, opportunities for all. "I just had the idea one day. I thought it would be really cool for our students to be able to do that. To show them and the community that students with disabilities are able to work just like everybody else. So we put together a little proposal. The Straker Foundation was very generous enough to give us all the money to get it up and running," explained Kate Kimble, the director of student services with MVESC. Already, a few upcoming scheduled stops are planned for the food truck, and the staff is hoping to add more to their calendar. Family Meals: A Simple Habit with Lasting Benefits

As families settle into busy fall schedules, September serves as a reminder of the importance of making time to eat together. Recognized as National Family Meals Month, this observance encourages families to share meals and strengthen connections around the table. Regular family meals provide benefits that extend well beyond nutrition. According to the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics (2026), children who participate in family meals are more likely to eat fruits, vegetables, and other nutrient-rich foods while developing healthy eating habits that can last a lifetime. Shared meals also support emotional and social well-being. Research has found that adolescents who eat regularly with their families experience higher self-esteem, better academic performance, and lower rates of tobacco, alcohol, and substance use. Family meals are also associated with lower levels of depressive symptoms and improved family communication.

For younger children, mealtimes provide opportunities to learn social skills, practice communication, and establish healthy daily routines. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (2026) recommends family mealtimes to model healthy eating behaviors and create positive experiences with food. Families can discuss important events that happened that day as well as uplift and encourage them. During dinner my mom would ask us to

Family meals do not need to be elaborate or time-consuming. A simple meal shared without distractions from televisions or mobile devices can create meaningful opportunities for conversation and connection. Even a few meals together each week can help build stronger families, encourage healthier habits, and promote overall well-being.

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3 US Schools Moved Forward in ARISS Selection Process

Amateur Radio on the International Space Station (ARISS) is pleased to announce that 3 additional US schools have been selected for ARISS contacts in 2026 and 2027. These schools submitted proposals during the recent proposal window and have been accepted to move forward in the processes of planning to host a scheduled amateur radio contact with crew on the ISS. The primary goal of the ARISS program is to engage young people in Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math (STEAM) activities and raise their awareness of space communications, radio communications, space exploration, and related areas of study and career possibilities.

ARISS USA is announcing selections for ham radio contacts with the ISS crew during the Fall 2026 through June, 2027. They are now at work starting to implement their 4-6-month education plan which was outlined in their proposal. These STEAM based educational activities help prepare students for their contact as well as create an on-going exploration and interest in aero-space and amateur radio topics. They are also completing an acceptable equipment plan that demonstrates their ability to execute the ham radio contact. Once their equipment plan is approved by ARISS, the final selected schools will be scheduled as their availability and flexibility match up with the scheduling opportunities offered by NASA.

West Muskingum finds its lucky number at 44 with two back-to-back wins

Vs. Morgan (9/11)

On Friday night in West Muskingum, the Morgan Raiders were hoping to upset the Tornadoes, but West M had better plans. The Tornadoes' defense was in full effect and held the Raiders scoreless through the first two quarters while lining up a 14 – 0 advantage before halftime. The intermission did not allow Morgan to find any cracks in the Tornadoes' defensive armor as they continued to hit a wall while trying to advance to the end zone. West, however, continued what they started, building a 27 – 0 lead before the end of the third quarter. In the last minutes, with the clock running, West continued scoring, with a final winning score of 44 – 0. The Tornadoes will host Philo on Friday, September 18th; kickoff is at 7 PM.

Vs. Maysville (9/4)

The Panthers stopped out to West Muskingum on Friday to face the Tornadoes on the football field. Within the first minutes of the first quarter, the Tornadoes blew the ceiling off of the place, starting with a 33-yard touchdown pass from Jake Welch to

Myles Wakefield to put the Tornadoes up 7 – 0 after the extra point. Just a few minutes later, Welch finds Bentley Bookless for a 13-yard touchdown to lead 14 – 0 after the PAT. The final touchdown for the first quarter comes at the hands of Cooper McKenzie, who charges 1 yard into the end zone to take a 21 – 0 lead by the end of the first quarter. Just inside the second quarter, Brooks McCune kicked a 24-yard field goal, 24 – 0. Maysville answers back with a touchdown in the second period, but Welch hits Carter Smith for a 32-yard touchdown pass to lead the game 31 – 7 at halftime after McCune's extra point. Back on the field, the two teams go head-to-head and stall each other out as the third quarter winds through without a score on either side of the ball. As the fourth quarter starts, West Muskingum finds their groove and blows through two more touchdowns, including a 33-yard pass from Welch to Grady Dollings and a Pick 6 from Kris Johnson, to add another 13 points to their already lofty lead and win the game 44 – 7.

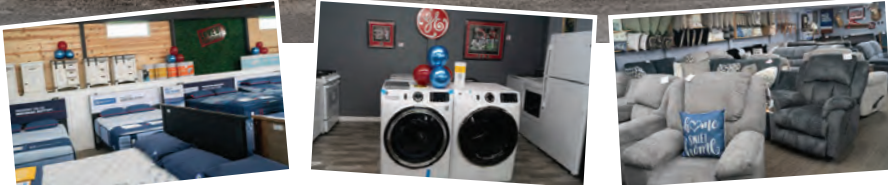

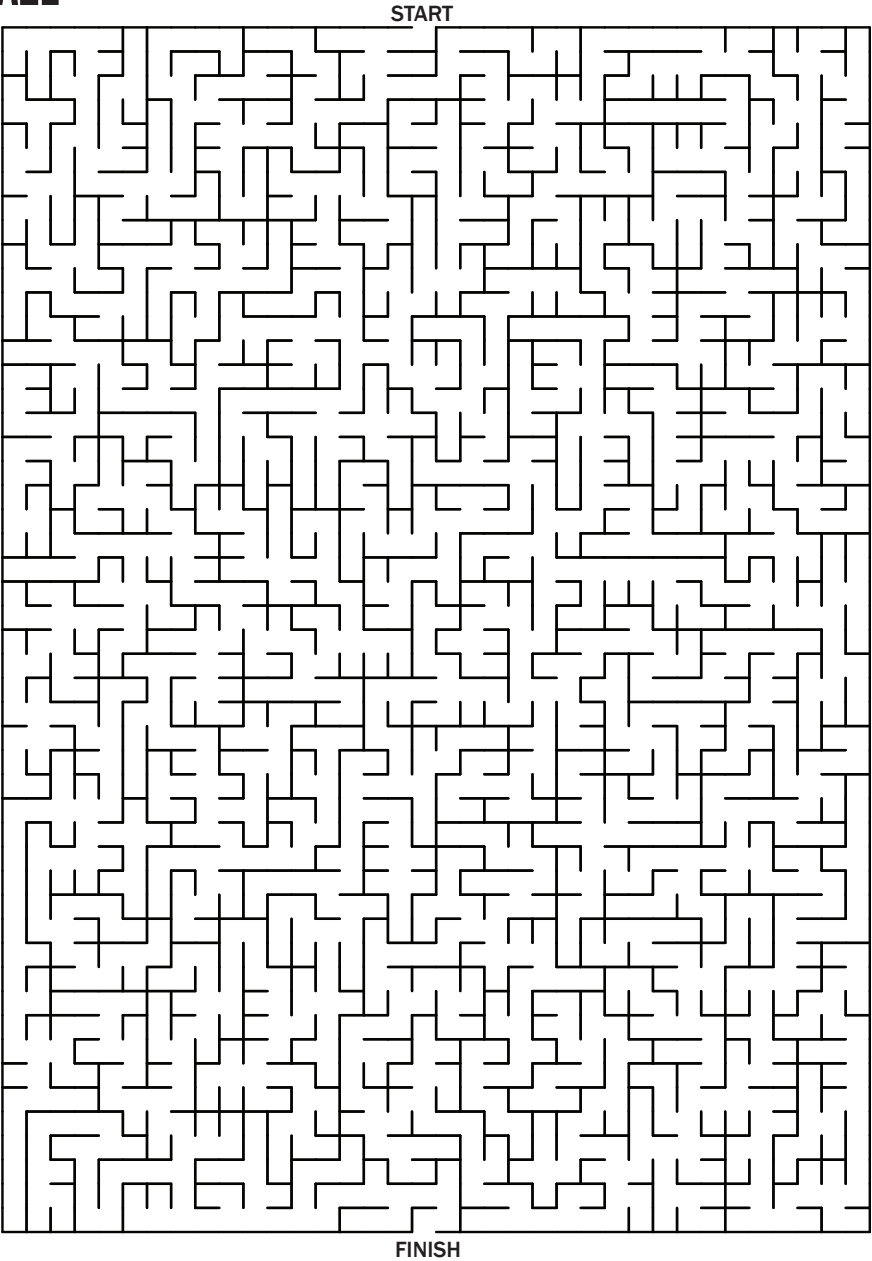

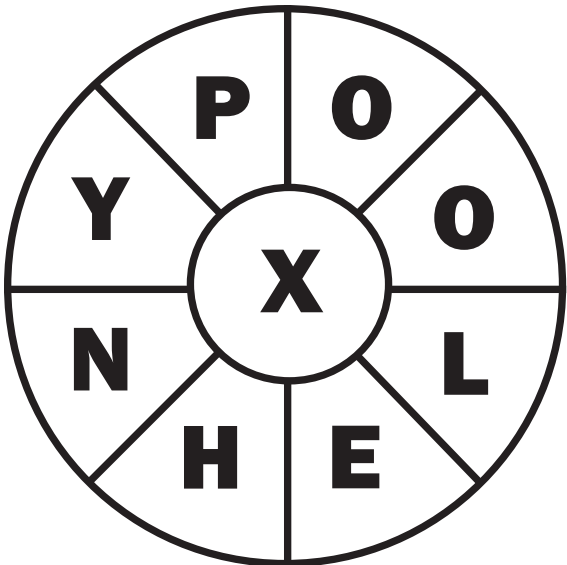
